Prerequisiti:

B1 Level English

Content Summary:

Method and materials that promote the student's ability to understand the main ideas of texts on topics of varying complexity; to be able to interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity to achieve natural interaction in an international environment; to produce a clear and detailed text on a range of topics relevant to the real world; to be able to explain a point of view on a topic.

Detailed content:

Key competences: Writing for writing tests email and short essay; Simple writing for messages and correspondence; Reading: ability to deduce information and analysing texts, reading techniques for tests. Listening: learning to listen: general, for specific info, for detail; Speaking: developing ability to interact and participate with reasoned arguments and opinion expressing one's opinion, presenting one's speech/material

For the acquisition and development of language skills: Grammar - all verb tenses, conditional, overcoming common errors, comparatives/superlatives, modal forms, causatives, gerunds v infinitives, articles, adverbs Lexicon: fields: university, places, landscapes; giving and asking for advice/information; common problems and situations for students, activities in civil society: sport, health, etc.; travelling,

For specific preparation for the B1 test: simulations, techniques and exercises of 'exam tasks'.



Learning objectives:

1. The course is aimed at preparing students for the CLA English B2 test
2. The course is aimed at assisting those interested in entering the B2 level parameters according to the European CEFR and/or improving their level of English

Recommended materials:

In class, it is essential to have access to a personal device of the tablet/laptop type (mobile phone) - working internet access (wifi Unipg)

- all teaching material is uploaded on the platform, within the course of reference
- optional: for those who want to supplement the course with printed and 'traditional' material for grammar and vocabulary, the use of Destination B1/B2 (MacMillan) is recommended.

Methods used in the classroom

The programme approach is 'student-centred learning' and communicative. Method therefore draws on communicative activities: collaborative and cooperative learning; as well as more traditional listening/grammar awareness/exam task activities.
