Course outline details:

1. Advanced listening comprehension

- Listening to complex texts such as lectures, podcasts, and debates on abstract and specific topics
- Developing the ability to understand subtleties in tone, intention, and irony
- Exercises to distinguish linguistic registers, such as formal, informal, and technical

2. Fluent oral production

- Conversations on complex topics, personal opinions, and the ability to support an argument in an articulate manner
- Techniques for responding to open-ended questions and conducting structured discussions
- Improvement of pronunciation, intonation, and rhythm for more natural expression

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3. Reading of specialized texts







- Analysis of articles, essays, reviews, and journalistic material
- Critical reading techniques to identify nuances of meaning, theses, and arguments
- Understanding and use of specific vocabulary related to various topics (science, economics, culture, etc.)

4. Formal and elaborate writing

- Composition of academic texts, comments on Class Forum (semi-formal), essays
- Use of complex sentences, logical connectors, and precise vocabulary to structure solid arguments
- Different writing styles

5. Advanced grammar and complex structures

- Review and use of complex verb tenses
- Advanced syntactic structures, such as inversion, cleft sentences, and concessive clauses
- Precision in the use of collocations and idiomatic expressions

6. Advanced vocabulary

- Expanding vocabulary with idiomatic terms, formal and informal expressions, phrasal verbs, and complex phrases
- Activities on synonyms and nuances of meaning to enhance lexical precision
- False friends and differences between languages

7. Culture and linguistic context

- Cultural, historical, and social aspects related to the countries where the language is spoken
- Regional differences, accents, and linguistic variants
- Discussions on current events and society to encourage critical reflection
